

This year's High Holiday services will once again be on Zoom. We had begun discussion as to how we might include a live gathering to our services. The impediments to such services were so insurmountable, however, that we concluded we had no alternative but to do Zoom for another year. This was before the recent pandemic, and

now in hindsight, we are convinced of the rightness of our decision.

Rabbi Schochet "retired" from officiating at services following the holidays of 2019. He agreed, with a bit of reluctance, to film in advance D'var Torahs and sermons for our 2020 services. Cantor Lutman agreed to participate from his home in Las vegas.

This year Rabbi Schochet will not be doing as much as he did last year, though he has filmed a few short prayer introductions that we can use as we see fit. Cantor Joe, however, is in Israel leading Bar Mitzvah services for one of his very special friends and will not be able to be with us.

The Ritual Committee undertook a search for a rabbi and cantor to lead our Zoom services. We are excited that we found two students who will be graduating this coming year from Rabbinical and Cantorial Schools. Emily Holtzman will be our rabbi. You will find a brief biography she prepared on page 5 of this Bulletin. She has a most interesting background, and has significant experiences in the field of Jewish education. As cantor, we have engaged the services of Heather Seid, who also has excellent credentials, and an excellent voice. She is also computer savvy and is interested in utilizing a "virtual choir" consisting of everyone who would like to sing or hum along with her on certain melodies. As we have communicated with you, Cantor Heather has provided instructions how you can record yourself, send your recording to her, and how she will insert the "choir" into services. I told Heather that I would introduce her as our cantorial and computer quru leading services. You can read her biography also on page 5.

On Saturday night, August 28, at 7:30 PM we will once again have a combined Selichot service with Temple Beth El, also on Zoom. Our speaker to start the evening will be Isaiah Oliver from the Community Foundation of Greater Flint. He will give an update of his talk from last year regarding race relations in the Flint area. Mr. Oliver is a most interesting speaker, and congregants were greatly impressed by his presentation last year. We are certain that this year will be no different. Following the speaker, we will have our traditional Selichot services led by Rabbi Ableser and myself.

Rosh Hashanah begins the Monday night of Labor Day, September 6. We will have services that evening at 6:00 pm with the rabbi, cantor and "choir" participating. On Tuesday and Wednesday, September 7 and 8, we will have services beginning at 9:30 Am, with the Torah services scheduled for around 10:00. At various times during services each day, Rabbi Emily will be speaking on the meaning of the prayers and explaining the rationale for the customs and practices of the holiday observances.

Zoom links will be sent out a couple of days before services. Obviously on Zoom we have to do things a bit differently than we have done at live in-person services, but we already know that we can provide meaningful holiday services on Zoom. One great advantage to Zoom is that we can have members and former members who have left Flint come back to Beth Israel and attend services. Some did last year, and we can

expect that even more will attend this year.

Following the Torah services each day, there will be the shofer blowing, which continues during the Musaf portion of the service. As last year, Benjamin Botkin and Ezraa Koenigsburg will be our shofer blowers. They are fantastic!

We are going to conclude services at about 1:00 PM. Come as you are, and stay as long as you want. Our goal is to experiment and have the most meaningful services possible.

Our traditional cemetery visitation will be on Sunday, September 12 from 10:00 to 11:00 AM at Machpelah Cemetery. Harold Steinman and I will be there to recite the K'eyl Molei prayers for those who want to remember and honor their loved ones.

Yom Kippur services will begin with Kol Nidrei on Wednesday, September 15, at 7:00 PM. A Mincha service will precede Kol Nidrei at 6:45. Services should end around 9:30 PM.

On Thursday, September 16, Yom Kippur services will begin at 9:30 AM. The Torah service should be around 10:00, and Yizkor at about 11:00. The Musaf services will follow and we aim to conclude those parts by 1:30 PM.

We return with Mincha at 5:30 PM. The Torah service is part of Mincha and will conclude with our special group chanting as a script the Maftir Yonah. We have been doing that for a number of years and our people have enjoyed tremendously this group chanting. If you haven't heard it, make sure you make note of it and Zoom on it. Neilah and Maariv follow Mincha. Yom Kippur will end with the final shofar blowing taking place around 8:15 PM.

Sisterhood will be distributing Rosh Hashanah bags before the holidays. Included in the bags will be the current Tree of Life booklet. Symbolically the bags will also contain sweets to refer to the hope of a sweet new year.

The Tashlich service (with shofer blowing being added as an additional ingredient) will be held at the "Steinman Bridge" in Western Hills on Sunday, September 12 at 4:30 pm. Following the service, we will go over to the Valley Restaurant on Elms and Calkins Roads for outside group dining. Should the weather not cooperate, we will reschedule for Monday or some later time. Should it be necessary to make changes, we will inform you of the new plans.

Information regarding Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah services will come to you as an email. All those services will also be Zoomed.

I want to take this opportunity to wish all congregants and friends a Happy, Healthy, Sweet, and Safe New Year. May we all be inscribed in the Book of Life for the coming year. Let us hope that Covid-19 will be significantly lessened, even removed, as a danger to society. Let us hope and pray also that peace and harmony shall come to the whole world.

We also extend our condolences to families who have lost members and friends this past year due to Covid or other illnesses. For each of them we say Zichrono/na Livracha-May their memories be for a blessing.

# SELICHOT PROGRAM AND SERVICE

SATURDAY EVENING AUGUST 28 • 7:30 PM

Many Jews prepare spiritually for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur by attending a special service call "Selichot" (forgiveness). The Selichot service is designed to help worshipers direct their hearts and minds to the Saturday evening before Rosh Hashanah, as long as Rosh Hashanah does not fall on the very next day. Otherwise, it's held a week before in order to give people a chance to reflect on the changes of behavior that they wish to make.

It has become a custom for the past several years that both CBI and TBE observe Selichot together. This year because of the pandemic we will again be conducting this program on Zoom. The evening will begin with a presentation by Isaiah Oliver, President of the Flint Community Foundation. He spoke with us last year about the racial situation in our community and this year he will update us about any progress or changes since our last meeting. We are very privileged that he has agreed to come back. Following his presentation there will be time for questions and discussion. We will finish the evening with a short service lead by Rabbi Ableser and Leonard Meizlish.

We hope you will join us as we get ready to observe the High Holidays.

When you get to the page it should have a tiny photo of Heather in the left hand corner with the words of the song and "by Heather Hoopes" under it.

On the right hand side there should be a green button

labeled "share" and a blue button labeled "song studio." In order to see and hear the video click the "song studio" button.

It should take you to a page with Heather's face. From here you can listen to the song by pressing the little black triangle in the lower left hand corner. Listen a couple of times and familiarize yourself with it before recording.

To make your recording to go with Heather's you will press the blue "+ Add track" button in the upper right hand corner. Connect your headphones to your computer before you start recording.

It will show you Heather's recording on the left and what your recording is showing on the right. Press the green "start recording" button in order to start the recording.

Once the recording is complete you can watch it back by pressing the blue "Play Preview" button in the upper right hand corner.

If you like what you see/hear press the green "Add to Song!" button on the lower left hand corner of the screen. If you would like to re-record you can press the red "Discard and Try Again" button in the lower right hand corner of the screen. (You can re-record as many times as you want till it's to your liking before adding your recording to the song!)

If once it's added to the song you feel it's too loud let Heather know - she can fix it from the back end. If you don't like the recording and want to try again let her know - she can delete that recording from the back end and you can try again. :)

Heather will collect all these recordings and merge them into many screens and lots of voices singing together. It's magical!! We encourage you to invite your children and grandchildren to participate. Forward the links to them. We can all do this from the comfort of our homes.

Edward Herbert Powers June 21, 1942 ~ July 14, 2021

Edward Herbert Powers, age 79, died peacefully on July 14 surrounded by his loving family. A beloved son, husband, father, cousin and friend who touched many lives, Edward was born in Jersey City, NJ, on June 21, 1942 to Samuel (Sam) and Ruth (Handman) Powers.

Ed was a force larger than life. His greatest loves were his wife, Phyllis, and his children and grandchildren. He also loved his large extended family and kept in touch with relatives from all over the world. In addition to family, Ed was a close confidant and trusted friend to many who appreciated his wicked sense of humor, his wisdom and his good counsel.

Ed graduated from Oak Park High School in 1957 and stayed in touch with his close-knit group of high school friends throughout his life. He received his BA in pre-legal studies from the University of Michigan in 1964 and his Juris Doctorate from The University of Michigan Law School in 1967. He met the love of his life, Phyllis Alpern, on the steps of the University of Michigan Union while an undergraduate student. He and Phyllis married in May 1966 and recently celebrated their 55th anniversary. Right out of law school, Ed joined the law practice of Morris and Michael Pelavin, Pelavin and Pelavin, later Pelavin, Pelavin, and Powers, PC. Ed remained at that practice for many years and later opened a private practice. Prior to retiring, he became a Certified Civil Mediator and opened a successful mediation practice. He became a member of the American Bar Association and the Michigan State Bar in 1967, and was known throughout Genesee County and Michigan as a highly respected attorney. He was also a member of the Genesee County Bar Association, the American Trial Lawyers Association, and the International Association of Lawyers and Judges. He was licensed before the Bar of Michigan by the U.S. District Courts of the Eastern and Western Districts of Michigan and was a member of the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals and the U.S. Supreme Court.

Ed was devoted to leading a Jewish life and was a lifelong learner from when he first insisted his parents send him to Hebrew school at age 10 until his final days when he continued discussions about Torah with his dear friends Rabbis Elijah Schochet and Yisroel Weingarten. An active leader in the Flint Jewish community, Ed participated on boards and fundraising campaigns for the Flint Jewish Federation, the United Jewish Appeal, and Congregation Beth Israel. He chanted Torah frequently and blew the shofar at the synagogue on high holidays.

Ed is survived by Phyllis (Alpern) Powers. He is also survived by their beloved children: son Alexander (Alec) Powers and daughter-in-law Jennifer Guthart Powers, daughter Jill Powers, daughter Annette Powers; and his grandsons Maxwell (Max) and Samuel (Sam) Powers and Noah Hamilton. Also left to cherish his memory are his cousin Gerry (Hoffman) Baron, who was like a sister to him, and many close friends and extended family members. In lieu of flowers or food, the family suggests a charitable donation in Ed's memory to Congregation Beth Israel of Flint, Chabad of Eastern Michigan, The Flint Jewish Federation, or the charitable organization of your choice. A private graveside service was held at Machpelah Cemetery, Flint. May Ed's memory be a blessing and may he be comforted among the mourners of Zion and Jerusalem.

# Yom Ha'Aliyah: A Day to Recognize Immigrants' Contributions to Israel

Yom Ha'Aliyah is an Israeli national holiday. The day commemorates the major role Jewish immigration has played since the State of Israel's founding in 1948. It is celebrated both on 10 Nisan and on 7 Cheshvan—the latter being the school celebration, occurring this year on October 13.

The observance commemorates the historic events of 10 Nisan, and thus acknowledges aliyah, immigration to the Jewish state, as a core value of the country. It also honors the contributions of immigrants to Israeli society. Because the 10th of Nisan occurs a few days before Passover, when schools are not in session, the observance is moved to a time when schools are open.

So what happened in history on 10 Nisan? On that day, according to the Book of Joshua (4:19), Joshua and the Israelites crossed the Jordan River at Gilgal with the Ark of the Covenant. It was the first great aliyah, calculated as being in the year 2488 (1272 BCE). God commanded the Israelites to mark the occasion by erecting twelve stones – for the twelve tribes – containing the text of the Torah.

10 Nisan also was the first Shabbat HaGadol, five days before the Israelites left Egypt at the beginning of the Exodus. It was also the date that Miriam, Moses' sister, passed away.

Aliyah means "a going up," an ascending, in this case into the Land of Israel. A person who "makes Aliyah" is an "oleh" (masculine, plural "olim") or an "olah" (feminine, plural "olot").

So why did they choose 7 Cheshvan for the school observance? Because we usually are reading Lekh-Lekha at that time, the parashah in which God orders Abraham to leave his home and family and go to the Land of Israel.



by reciting the Mourner's Kaddish in the company of a Minvan. Though circumstances prevent me from doing so, may my yearning and prayers find favor in Your eyes, and be accepted and received before You as if I had prayed that Kaddish.

May you grant hope and healing to all who suffer, and may we soon be able to once again safely gather in holiness and joy.

May Your name Adonai, be elevated and sanctified everywhere on earth and may peace reign everywhere.




