- PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Now that Simchat Torah is over, we have come to the end of the High Holiday season. Not only did we return to the chapel for services, we also broadcast our services over Zoom/live stream.

I have heard only good things about the services. Both Josh Jacobs and Heather Seid, who led our services, were very well received by those who attended. Each of them were highly praised by our membership, and both of them had nice things to say about our membership. It was a mutual admiration society by all involved.

As I have repeatedly said, the Zooming/live streaming is a work in progress. Fortunately we had no glitches during the services, and we were able to reach people that we otherwise couldn't have been able to. We basically had full attendance in our chapel for all services. We had reservations for about thirty plus guests in the chapel for all services. On zoom we had as many as sixty screens open during peak times. That would mean that we had as many as ninety to a hundred people at services. That is a tremendous number, and all of us involved in the planning have been overjoyed. "Yasher koach" to all our participants, and a special "yasher koach" to Wendy Flamenbausm, Judy Kasle, and Beth Katz for all their time and effort in making everything possible.

Rabbi Schochet continues his interest in the congregation. I talk with him quite frequently, and we exchange ideas regarding Judaism and how best to serve our membership. I know he is also in contact with many members. It is particularly note-worthy that he still talks very positively about us to his students. Cantor Heather has been one of his students and she has said she learned much about the congregation from him before she even came to us.

It is possible that some of you may have ideas you would like to share with others. If you will send them along to me or Beth, we will make certain that we share your ideas through the bulletin and/or our emails.

On another note, you might notice that we are increasing our activities jointly with the Temple. Not only do we share facilities, we are increasing our cooperation with both the Temple and Federation. This past Shabbat, Sheldon and Hadar led a Friday evening service following a catered dinner. Also, during the Shabbat Selichot weekend a few weeks prior, CBI, TBE, and FJF co-sponsored multiple services featuring Noah Aronson, a well known artist and composer on the Jewish musical scene. We will continue to cooperate with each other through the year. Rabbi Ableser of TBE and Steve and Susan Low are greatly enthusiastic about such cooperation. Rabbi and Shainie Weingarten of Chabad also sponsor programs of community interest and I personally find it most gratifying that we are able to co-operate/participate with them also.




We enjoyed a beautiful evening on October 2 as we observed Tashlich by casting away our sins into the creek from the "Steinman"

Who is the Challah Prince?



Idan Chabasov, aka the Challah Prince, does not trace his love of challah baking back to a family tradition. There was no aroma of freshly baked challah in the kitchens of either his Turkish or Bukharin grandmothers nor in the Tel Aviv home where he grew up. Cooking and baking was not an interest he ever pursued.

Fast forward to his mid-30s and the Challah Prince Instagram account, set up in January 2020, now boasts over 70,000 followers. Chabasov was excited to travel to the US four times this year to do workshops and hold a popup in the restaurant of a well-known New York chef. His regular online workshops are full of participants from all over the world and, in Israel, the influencer will soon appear in an ad campaign for a credit card company.

Chabasov started to bake challah after he moved to Berlin in 2014. "I began going to small Shabbat dinners for Israelis in the city. Once I remember looking at the table and realizing there was regular bread but no challah. So I decided to take it upon myself to be the one to bake and bring challah each week. Every Friday I would also go to my German neighbors and give them a freshly baked challah. At first, they thought it was bizarre that anyone would bring them food as it's not a custom people are used to doing, as we are in Israel. In the end, they were so appreciative."

It's easy to see why the Challah Prince brand has many admirers. Chabasov's intricately braided challot, which can include weaving an impressive 17 strands, are traditional but innovative. Each creation shows off his artistry in its unbaked form or a mouthwatering golden brown. Chabasov explains. "Challah making is a special process of observation and patience. I always stress in my workshops that it's the journey and not the outcome which is important. Eating it, in the end, is just a bonus."

Mind University – Exercise your Brain

All of us who are lucky enough to live a long life will experience some form of age-related cognitive decline. If you're feeling inspired and ready to take action to slow this cognitive decline, now is the perfect time. Cognitive training is not simply doing crossword puzzles or playing games on our phones. One of the best steps you can take is to sign up for a cognitive training course. The right kind of cognitive stimulation is critical. Just like we exercise our bodies to be as strong as possible as we age, there are specific exercises we can do to have our cognition as strong as possible!

A rigorous curriculum of these exercises strengthens each of the areas of our cognition that we count on every day. These areas include:

Reaction Time	Memory (4 different types)
Visual Spatial Skills	Language
Attention & Concentration	Problem Solving

We are very lucky to have access to fun and engaging cognitive training classes in the Flint and Genesee County area, licensed through the New England Cognitive Center and facilitated by the Detroit Jewish Family Service staff and Flint Jewish Federation Staff.


